Further to your request and authorization, Paterson Group (Paterson) conducted a Phase I – Environmental Site Assessment (Phase I ESA) Update for the aforementioned properties, henceforth referred to as the Phase I Property. This report updates a previous Phase I ESA report, completed by Paterson in August 2015.

This letter report is intended to meet the requirements for an updated Phase I ESA, as per Ontario Regulation 153/04, and is to be read in conjunction with the previous 2015 Phase I ESA report.

Site Information

The Phase I Property consists of seven parcels of land situated on the north and south sides of Cope Drive, between Akerson Road and Terry Fox Drive, in the City of Ottawa, Ontario.

Each of the parcels of land currently consist of vacant grassland, and are situated within a municipal urban setting consisting of mixed residential, parkland, and commercial land uses.

Previous Engineering Reports

The following report was reviewed prior to conducting this assessment:

- “Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Vacant Land – Cope Drive at Akerson Road, Ottawa, Ontario”*, prepared by Paterson Group and dated August 14, 2015.

According to the findings of the previous 2015 Phase I ESA, the Phase I Property has never been formally developed and has historically been used as agricultural land. The neighbouring properties were also historically used for agricultural purposes until developed with residential dwellings circa 2009.

No potentially contaminating activities (PCAs), resulting in areas of potential environmental concern (APECs), were identified on the Phase I Property. No further work was recommended by Paterson following the issuance of the Phase I ESA report.

Historical Records Review

Phase I ESA Study Area Determination

A radius of approximately 250 m was determined to be appropriate as a Phase I Study Area for this assignment. Properties located outside of this radius are not considered to have had the potential to impact the Phase I Property, based on their significant separation distances.

First Developed Use Determination

Based on a review of available historical information, the Phase I Property has never been formally developed.

National Pollutant Release Inventory

A search of the National Pollutant Release Inventory (NPRI) database did not identify any records of pollutant releases pertaining to the Phase I Property or any of the neighbouring properties.

Ontario PCB Waste Storage Site Inventory

A search of the Ontario PCB waste storage site inventory was conducted as part of this assessment. The search did not identify any current or former PCB waste storage sites situated within the Phase I Study Area.

MECP Coal Gasification Plant Inventory

The Ontario Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks document entitled, "*Municipal Coal Gasification Plant Site Inventory, 1991*" was reviewed as part of this assessment. This document provides a reference to the locations of former coal gasification plants situated in the Province of Ontario. A review of this document did not identify any former coal gasification plants located on the Phase I Property or within the Phase I Study Area.

MECP Waste Disposal Site Inventory

The Ontario Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks document entitled, "*Waste Disposal Site Inventory in Ontario, 1991*" was reviewed as part of this assessment. This document includes all recorded active and closed waste disposal sites, industrial manufactured gas plants, and coal tar distillation plants situated in the Province of Ontario. A review of this document did not identify any relevant records pertaining to the Phase I Property or for properties located within the Phase I Study Area.

MECP Brownfields Environmental Site Registry

A search of the MECP Brownfields Environmental Site Registry was conducted as part of this assessment. No Records of Site Condition (RSCs) were identified in the database has having been filed for the Phase I Property or for any properties situated within the Phase I Study Area.

MECP Submissions

A request was submitted to the MECP Freedom of Information office for information with respect to reports related to environmental conditions for the Phase I Property. A response from the MECP had not been received prior to the issuance of this report.

MECP Instruments

A request was submitted to the MECP Freedom of Information office for information with respect to certificates of approval, permits to take water, certificates of property use, or any other similar MECP issued instruments for the Phase I Property. A response from the MECP had not been received prior to the issuance of this report.

MECP Incident Reports

A request was submitted to the MECP Freedom of Information office for information with respect to records concerning environmental incidents, orders, offences, spills, discharges of contaminants, or inspections maintained by the MECP for the Phase I Property or neighbouring properties. A response from the MECP had not been received prior to the issuance of this report.

MECP Waste Management Records

A request was submitted to the MECP Freedom of Information office for information with respect to waste management records for the Phase I Property. A response from the MECP had not been received prior to the issuance of this report.

ERIS Database Report

A database report, prepared by ERIS (Environmental Risk Information Services) Ltd., dated September 30, 2021, was acquired and reviewed as part of this assessment. The complete ERIS report has been appended to this letter.

On-Site Records:

The ERIS report did not identify any relevant records pertaining to the Phase I Property.

Off-Site Records:

The ERIS report did not identify any records pertaining to properties located within the Phase I Study Area.

City of Ottawa Former Landfill Sites

The document prepared by Golder Associates entitled, “*Old Landfill Management Strategy, Phase I - Identification of Sites, City of Ottawa*”, was reviewed as part of this assessment. No former landfill sites were identified on the Phase I Property or within the Phase I Study Area.

City of Ottawa Historical Land Use Inventory (HLUI) Database

As part of this assessment, a requisition form was submitted to the City of Ottawa to request information from the City’s Historical Land Use Inventory (HLUI 2005) database for any environmental records pertaining to the Phase I Property as well as any properties situated within the Phase I Study Area.

The response from the City indicated that no records were identified pertaining to the Phase I Property and no environmental concerns were identified with respect to any records returned for properties situated within the Phase I Study area.

A copy of the HLUI results have been appended to this letter.

Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA)

The TSSA Fuels Safety Branch in Toronto was contacted electronically, as part of this assessment, to inquire about current and former underground fuel storage tanks, spills, and historical incidents for the Phase I Property and neighbouring properties.

The response from the TSSA indicated that no records were identified pertaining to the Phase I Property or the neighbouring properties.

A copy of the correspondence with the TSSA has been appended to this letter.

Aerial Photographs

The most recent photograph reviewed in the 2015 Phase I ESA report was taken in 2002. For this update, more recent aerial photographs, taken in 2008 and 2019, were reviewed as part of our assessment.

In the 2008 aerial photograph, the Phase I Property and the surrounding lands appear to be stripped of native vegetation and topsoil in preparation for the development of the surrounding residential subdivision.

In the 2019 aerial photograph, the Phase I Property appears to be vacant, while the surrounding lands appear to be developed with residential dwellings and a playground. The Phase I Property and the surrounding lands appear in this photograph as they do today.

No environmental concerns were identified with respect to the Phase I Property or the neighbouring properties during the time period reviewed. A copy of the 2008 and 2019 aerial photographs have been appended to this letter.

Water Bodies

No water bodies are present on the Phase I Property. The nearest named water body with respect to the Phase I Property is the Monahan Drain (part of Mahoney Creek) which is situated directly in between 88 and 110 Cope Drive.

OMNRF Areas of Natural and Scientific Interest

A search for areas of natural and scientific interest situated within the Phase I Study Area was conducted electronically via the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (OMNRF) website. The search did not identify any natural features of areas of natural significance within the Phase I Study Area.

Geological Maps

The Geological Survey of Canada website on the Urban Geology of the National Capital Area was consulted as part of this assessment. Based on the mapping information from NRCAN, the bedrock within the area of the Phase I Property consists of interbedded limestone and dolomite of the Gull River Formation, whereas the surficial geology consists of offshore marine deposits (clay and silt) with an overburden thickness ranging from approximately 10 m to 15 m.

Topographic Maps

A topographic map was reviewed from the Natural Resources Canada – The Atlas of Canada website as part of this assessment. The topographic map indicates that the general elevation of the Phase I Property is approximately 100 m above sea level. The regional topography in the general area of the Phase I Property slopes down towards the southeast. An illustration of the referenced topographic map is presented on Figure 2 – Topographic Map, appended to this letter.

Physiographic Maps

A physiographic map was reviewed from the Natural Resources Canada – The Atlas of Canada website, as a part of this assessment. According to the publication and mapping information, the Phase I Property is situated within the St. Lawrence Lowlands. According to the description provided: *“The lowlands are plain-like areas that were affected by the Pleistocene glaciations and are therefore covered by surficial deposits and other features associated with the ice sheets.”* The Phase I Property is specifically located within the Central St. Lawrence Lowland area, which is rarely more than 150 m above sea level.

MECP Water Well Records

A search of the MECPs website for all drilled well records within a 250 m radius of the Phase I Property was conducted as part of this assessment. The search identified one well record within the Phase I Study Area. This record pertains to a well installed in 1956 and used for domestic household purposes. Based on the availability of municipal services, no drinking water wells are expected to be currently in use within the Phase I Study Area.

According to the well record, the overburden stratigraphy in the area of the Phase I Property generally consists predominantly of brown and grey clay. Bedrock, consisting of limestone, was typically encountered at an average depth of approximately 30 m below ground surface.

Personal Interview

Mr. John Angelosante, a representative from Cavanagh Construction, was contacted via email to respond to questions regarding the environmental history of the Phase I Property. According to Mr. Angelosante, no significant changes have been made to the Phase I Property since the time of the previous 2015 Phase I ESA. Mr. Angelosante was unaware of any potential environmental concerns pertaining to the Phase I Property.

Site Reconnaissance

A site inspection was conducted on September 22, 2021, between 1:30 PM and 2:30 PM, by personnel from Paterson's environmental department. In addition to the Phase I Property, the present-day uses of the neighbouring properties within the Phase I Study Area were also assessed at the time of the site inspection.

Buildings and Structures

No buildings or structures are currently present on the Phase I Property.

Site Description

Each of the seven parcels of land composing the Phase I Property are currently vacant and consist entirely of grass covered land, with the exception of a small gravel covered storage lot on 80 Cope Drive.

The Phase I Property is considered to be at grade with the adjacent roads as well as the surrounding properties. The site topography is relatively flat, whereas the regional topography slopes very gently down towards the southeast.

Water drainage on the Phase I Property occurs primarily via infiltration throughout the property, as well as via surface run-off towards catch basins present on the adjacent streets. No ponded water, stressed vegetation, or any other indications of potential sub-surface contamination were observed on-site at the time of the site inspection.

Potential Environmental Concerns

Fuels and Chemical Storage

No chemical storage areas, above ground storage tanks (ASTs), or signs of underground storage tanks (USTs) were observed on the exterior of the Phase I Property at the time of the site inspection.

No hazardous materials, unidentified chemicals, spills, stains, or abnormal odours were observed on the Phase I Property at the time of the site inspection.

Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) and Transformer Oil

Two pad-mounted transformers were identified on 140 Cope Drive, while another two pad-mounted transformers were identified on 151 Cope Drive. The transformers were noted to be in good condition at the time of the site inspection, with no signs of any leaks or stains observed within their vicinity. No environmental concerns were identified with respect to the presence of these transformers.

Waste Management

No waste materials are currently being generated on the Phase I Property.

Fill Material

No evidence of any imported fill material was identified on the Phase I Property at the time of the site inspection.

Neighbouring Properties

An inspection of the neighbouring properties was conducted from publicly accessible roadways at the time of the site inspection. Land use adjacent to the Phase I Property was observed as follows:

- North:* Residential dwellings and the Monahan Drain. A playground is present at the northwest corner of Cope Drive and Akerson Road;
- East:* Residential dwellings;
- West:* Residential dwellings, followed by agricultural land;
- South:* Residential dwellings.

No environmental concerns were identified with respect to the current use of the neighbouring lands.

Current land use within the Phase I Study Area is illustrated on Drawing PE3613-4 Surrounding Land Use Plan, appended to this letter.

Review and Evaluation of Information

Land Use History

Based on a review of available historical information, the Phase I Property has never been formally developed.

Potentially Contaminating Activities (PCAs)

No potentially contaminating activities (PCAs) were identified on the Phase I Property or within the Phase I Study Area.

Areas of Potential Environmental Concern (APECs)

No areas of potential environmental concern were identified on the Phase I Property.

Contaminants of Potential Concern (CPCs)

No contaminants of potential concern were identified on the Phase I Property.

Conceptual Site Model

Geological and Hydrogeological Setting

Based on the mapping information from NRCAN, the bedrock within the area of the Phase I Property consists of interbedded limestone and dolomite of the Gull River Formation, whereas the surficial geology consists of offshore marine deposits (clay and silt) with an overburden thickness ranging from approximately 10 m to 15 m.

Based on the regional topography, the groundwater is interpreted to be moving in a southeasterly direction.

Existing Buildings and Structures

No buildings or structures are currently present on the Phase I Property.

Water Bodies and Areas of Natural and Scientific Interest

No areas of natural and scientific interest are known to exist within the Phase I Study Area. The nearest named water body with respect to the Phase I Property is the Monahan Drain (part of Mahoney Creek) which is situated directly in between 88 and 110 Cope Drive.

Drinking Water Wells

Based on the availability of municipal services, no drinking water wells are expected to be currently in use within the Phase I Study Area.

Neighbouring Land Use

The neighbouring lands within the Phase I Study Area consist of a combination of residential, parkland, and commercial properties.

Potentially Contaminating Activities and Areas of Potential Environmental Concerns

Based on the findings of this Phase I ESA Update, no potentially contaminating activities (PCAs), resulting in areas of potential environmental concern (APEC), were identified in the Phase I Study Area.

Contaminants of Potential Concern

No contaminants of potential concern were identified on the Phase I Property.

Assessment of Uncertainty and/or Absence of Information

The information available for review as part of the preparation of this Phase I ESA Update is considered to be sufficient to conclude that there are no PCAs or APECs associated with the Phase I Property. The absence of any PCAs was confirmed by a variety of independent sources, and as such, the conclusions of this report are not affected by uncertainty which may be present with respect to the individual sources.

Conclusions and Recommendations

A review of more recent historical information, in combination with personal interviews and a site inspection, generally confirmed the findings presented in the previous 2015 Phase I ESA. The Phase I Property has not changed significantly since the time of the previous 2015 Phase I ESA and no new environmental concerns were identified as part of this assessment. It is our opinion that **a Phase II ESA is not required for the Phase I Property.**

Statement of Limitations

This Phase I – Environmental Site Assessment (Phase I ESA) Update report has been prepared in general accordance with Ontario Regulation 153/04, as amended, under the Environmental Protection Act. The conclusions presented herein are based on information gathered from a limited historical review and field inspection program. The findings of this Phase I ESA Update are based on a review of readily available geological, historical, and regulatory information and a cursory review made at the time of the field assessment.

Should any conditions be encountered at the Phase I Property and/or historical information that differ from our findings, we request that we be notified immediately in order to allow for a reassessment.

This report was prepared for the sole use of TCK Co-Tenancy and Cavanagh Construction. Permission and notification from the aforementioned parties and Paterson Group will be required prior to the release of this report to any other party.

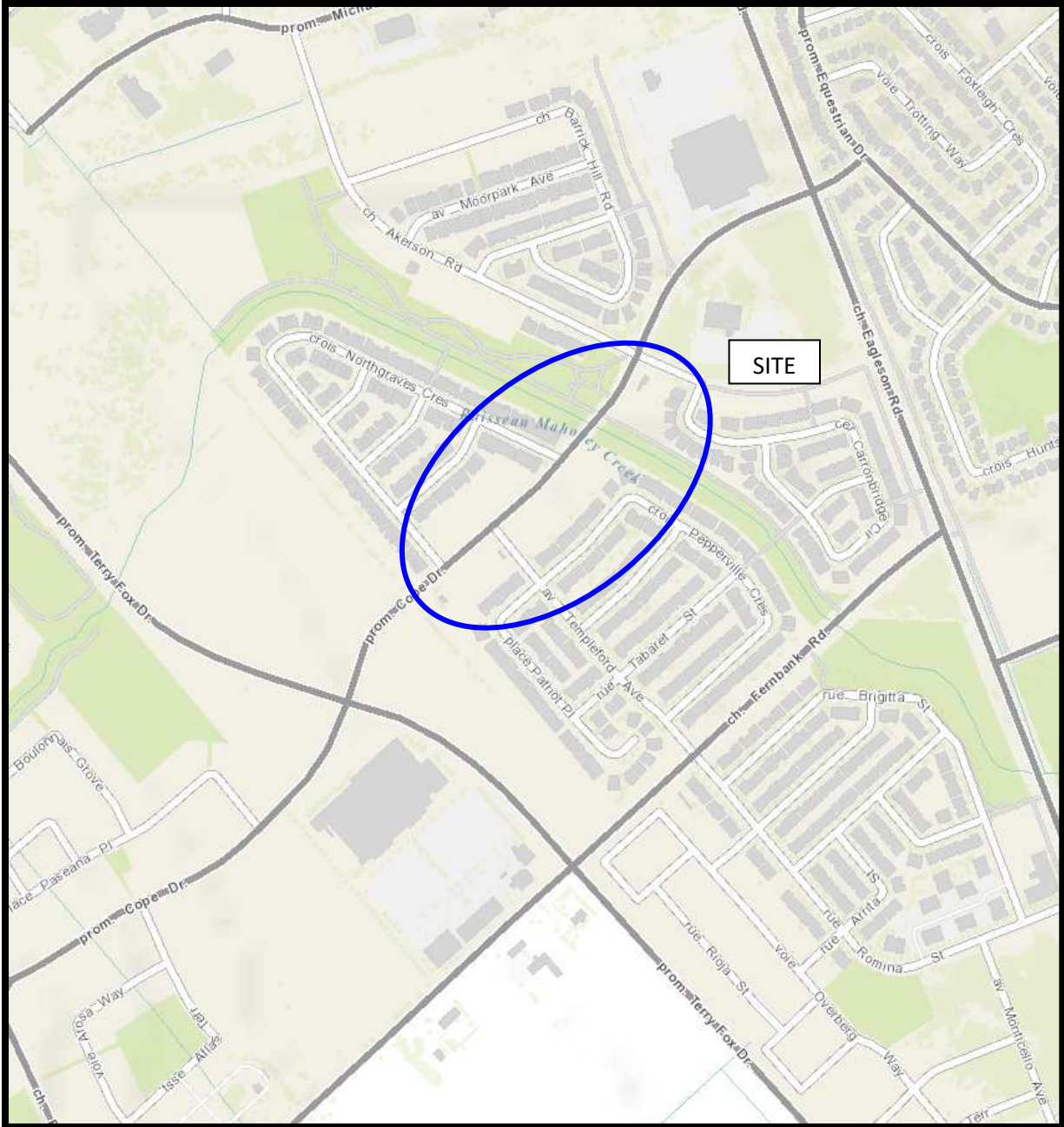

KEY PLAN

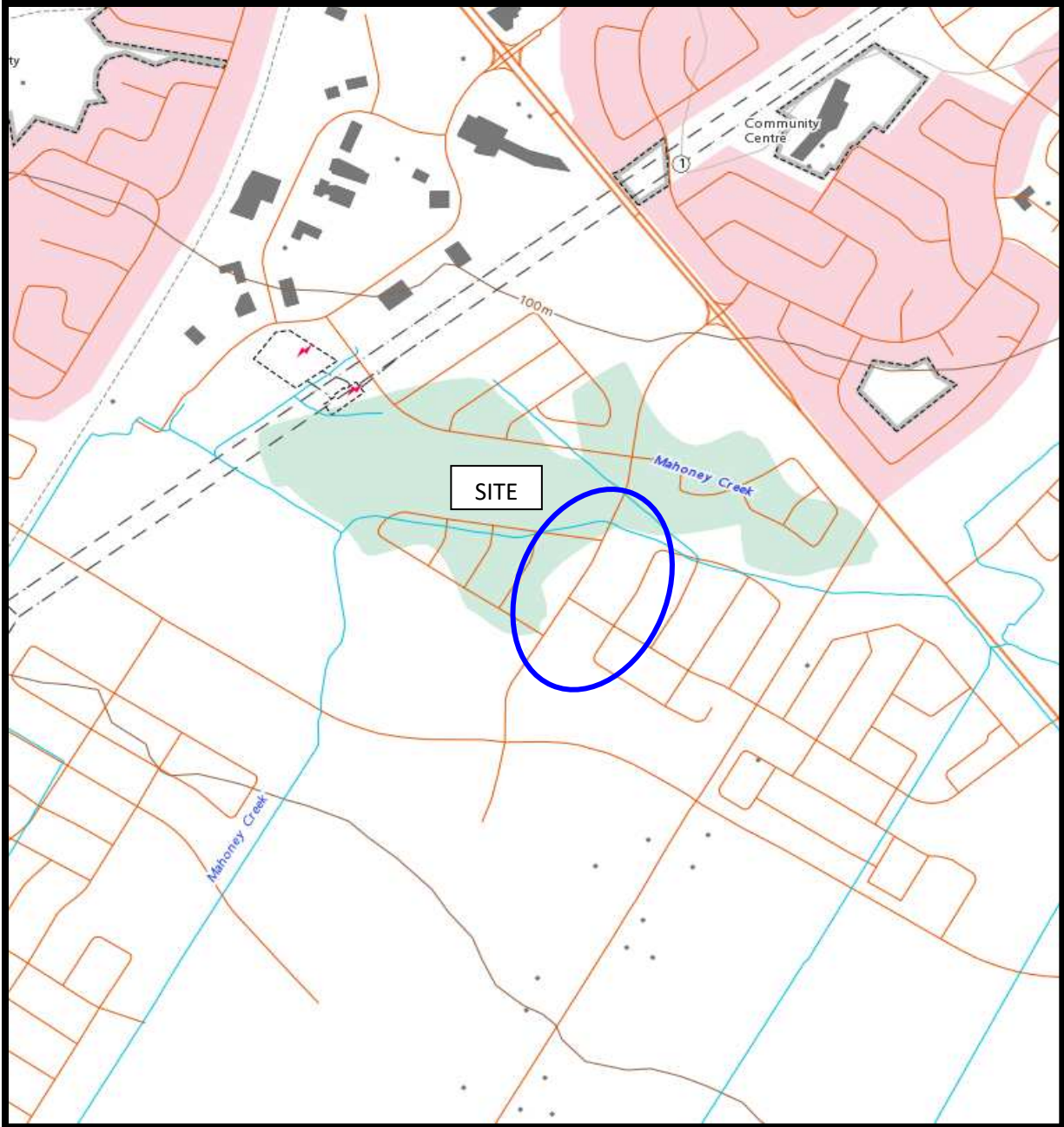
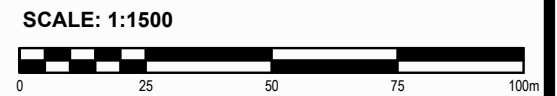
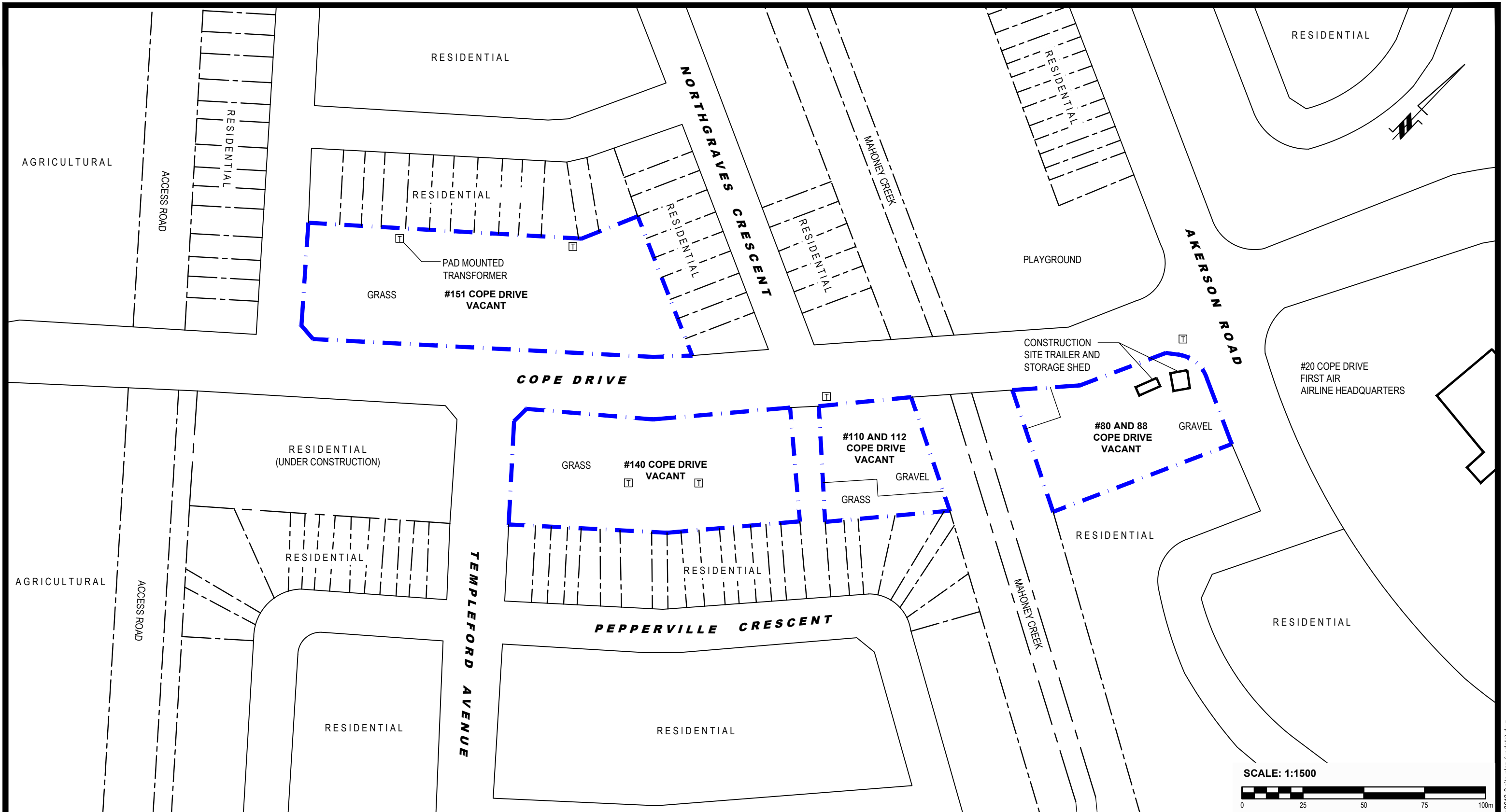


FIGURE 2

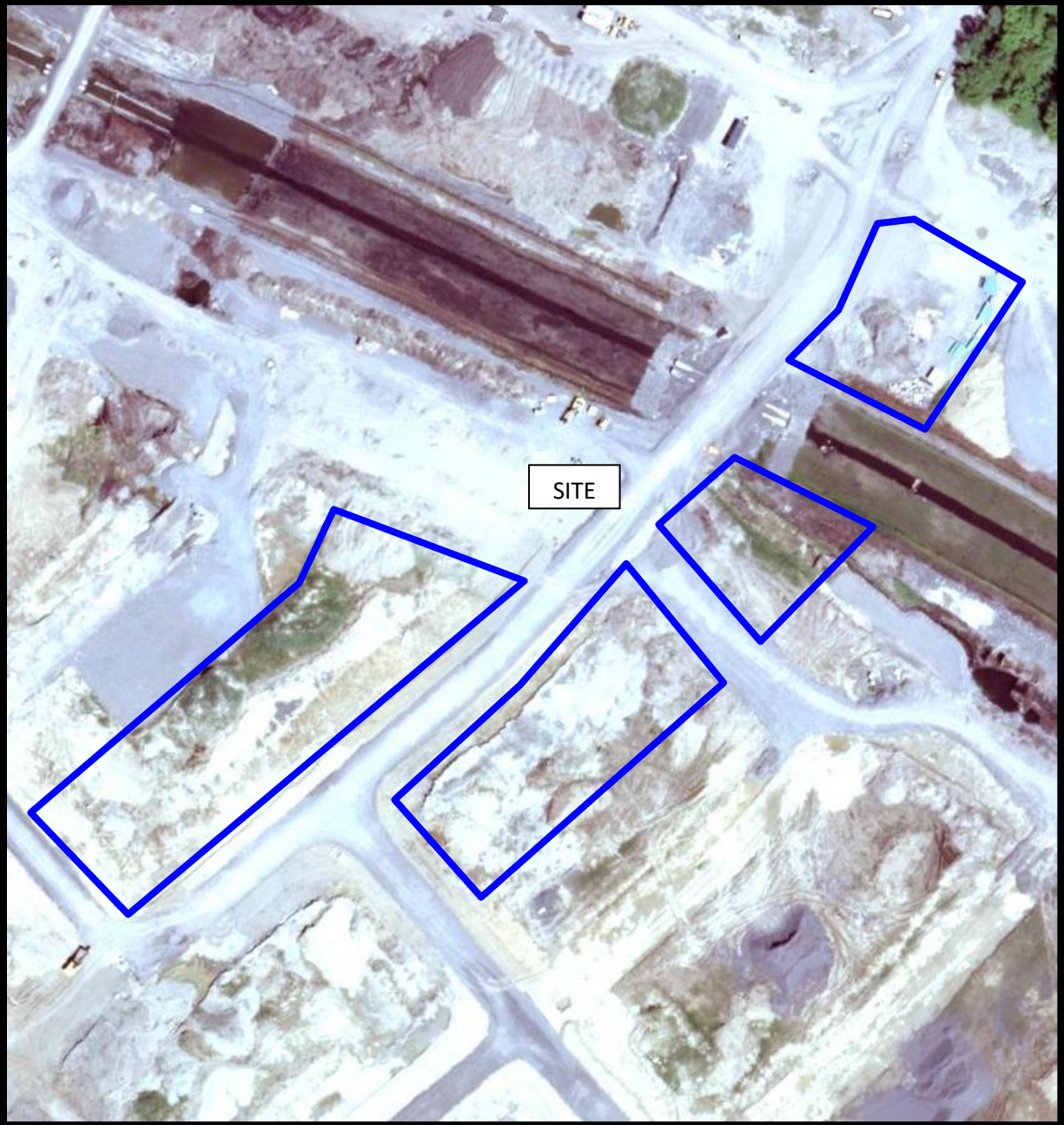

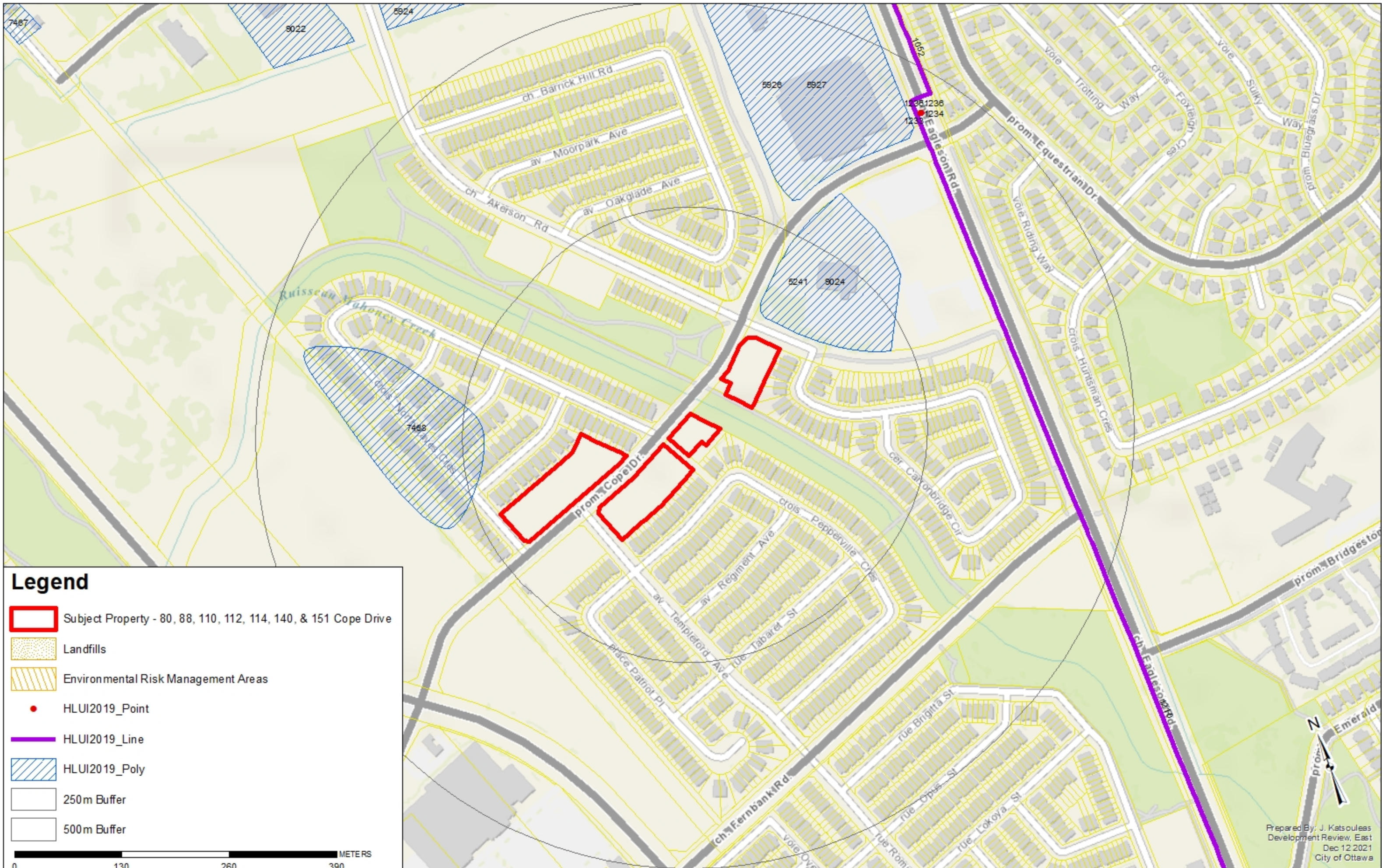

Definitions

Database Descriptions: This section provides a detailed explanation for each database including: source, information available, time coverage, and acronyms used. They are listed in alphabetic order.

Detail Report: This is the section of the report which provides the most detail for each individual record. Records are summarized by location, starting with the project property followed by records in closest proximity.

Distance: The distance value is the distance between plotted points, not necessarily the distance between the sites' boundaries. All values are an approximation.

Direction: The direction value is the compass direction of the site in respect to the project property and/or center point of the report.

Elevation: The elevation value is taken from the location at which the records for the site address have been plotted. All values are an approximation. Source: Google Elevation API.

Executive Summary: This portion of the report is divided into 3 sections:

'Report Summary'- Displays a chart indicating how many records fall on the project property and, within the report search radii.

'Site Report Summary'-Project Property'- This section lists all the records which fall on the project property. For more details, see the 'Detail Report' section.

'Site Report Summary-Surrounding Properties'- This section summarizes all records on adjacent properties, listing them in order of proximity from the project property. For more details, see the 'Detail Report' section.

Map Key: The map key number is assigned according to closest proximity from the project property. Map Key numbers always start at #1. The project property will always have a map key of '1' if records are available. If there is a number in brackets beside the main number, this will indicate the number of records on that specific property. If there is no number in brackets, there is only one record for that property.

The symbol and colour used indicates 'elevation': the red inverted triangle will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Lower Elevation', the yellow triangle will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Higher Elevation' and the orange square will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Same Elevation.'

Unplottables: These are records that could not be mapped due to various reasons, including limited geographic information. These records may or may not be in your study area, and are included as reference.
